Summer is here and we can expect some hot days.

The wind we enjoy for sailing is caused by the energy from the Sun.

Some interesting facts about the Sun and Earth.

Diameter of the sun = 1,392,000 Km

Diameter of the earth = 12,714 Km

Distance from the earth to the sun = 150,000,000 Km .

To drive that distance would need 500 new cars if each traveled 300,000 Km before scrapping and would need 15,000,000 litres of fuel at 10 litres/100Km costing \$27,150,000 at \$1.81 per litre and would take 171 years. The time taken at Concorde speed = 7 years.

At the speed of light it would take 8 minutes not counting the time to get to the speed of light and to stop at the other end.

It takes 177 days to reach the speed of light at an acceleration of 2g and 177 days to slow down at 2g.



The sun is 1.3 million times bigger than the earth in volume.

The sun is 300 thousand times as heavy as the earth.

The total energy radiated from the sun is 2,200,000,000,000,000,000 kW. That is very very impressive.

Only 45 billionths of 1% of the sun's energy hits the earth's upper atmosphere that is 0.000000045% or 99,000,000,000 kW. The rest misses us going in other directions.

I tried to get the sun and earth to scale on this page but it is not possible.

The width of my screen is 370mm. At this scale the sun would need to be 3.4mm diameter and the earth 0.03mm diameter which you would not see. Smaller than a full stop.

Our earth day is 24 hours and our earth year is approximately 365 days. The axis of rotation tilts 23.4°. A variation of as little as 10% in any of the figures highlighted thus here and at the top of this page would be very big trouble for us.

Perhaps we are not very significant when sailing on a little lake in a little country at the ends of the earth a vast distance from the sun.

Would you like some more stats on the distance to the next closest star?
